• To receive county mental health services through Dakota county:

- A mental health evaluation dated within last six months needs to be completed before contacting the county for services
- Once an evaluation has been completed, the county provides a mental health case manager and to work with you/your family
- There are many low-cost mental health services throughout the county. Some options are listed below.
- To receive mental health services:
  - Contact your parent/guardian's insurance company to ask which nearby clinic you can visit and whether it is free or has a cost

#### Vaccines for adolescents

• Human Papillomavirus (HPV): Three doses starting at age 11–12 years.

- Meningococcal: Two doses starting at age 11–12 years.
- Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis (Tdap): One dose at age 11–12 years.

#### Vaccines for all

• Influenza ("Flu"): Each year for everyone age 6 months or older.

# Low-cost vaccines for children and adolescents (18 years and younger)

Many clinics in Dakota County provide immunizations at low or no-cost to children without insurance through the Minnesota Vaccines for Children (MnVFC) Program. Call your clinic to find out if they participate in that program. The Dakota County Public Health Department also provides immunizations for children of all ages without insurance at our walk-in clinics and by appointment. These clinics also serve children on Minnesota health care plans including MA, MNCare or PMAP. Children under 18 years of age must be accompanied by an adult. Parent or guardian must sign a Minor Authorization Form. For current information about immunizations from Public Health, call the Immunization Information Line at 952-891-7999 (English and Spanish).

# Clinics for Immunizations or other Medical Care (call them for more info):

  - Have you ever felt remorseful about your drinking or drug use?
  - Have you ever had a drink or used drugs in the morning in order to relieve a hangover or steady your nerves?
  - Two or more Yes answers may indicate a problem with alcohol or drugs.
    - The four question quiz is based on the CAGE substance abuse screening tool.

    - Don't have health insurance that covers chemical dependency treatment or the insurance plan has denied coverage
    - Meet the Minnesota State guidelines for income and household size
    - A chemical health assessment consists of: A chemical dependency/drug evaluation and a determination of the need for chemical dependency/drug treatment
    - Funding may be available through the Consolidated Chemical Dependency Treatment
      Fund (CCDTF). You will be asked to provide proof of income (pay stubs, bank records)
      and proof of residency at the time of application to allow the county to determine if you
      are eligible for this assistance. CCDTF is a funding source of last resort and other
      options for payment must first be explored.
